Program Description

The Master of Science in Guidance and Counseling is designed for those individuals who seek advanced professional training in various student and human support services particularly in non-clinical settings such as education, business, health care, community extension programs and even judicial services. The program is an integration of academic foundations and professional training which is directed towards developing a qualified and

specialized professional.

Program Educational Objectives

In line with the University Mission statement, the program is designed to:

1. equip students with advanced knowledge, skills and capabilities required in the areas of guidance and counseling psychology;
2. enable them to use these skills in the development of one's self and the holistic development of others;

3. develop positive work ethics and commitment to social transformation.

Admission Policies

A student seeking admission to the program must comply with the following:

1. hold a degree with 12 units of related courses in psychology, guidance and counseling, behavioral sciences or other related fields from an accredited college or university;
2. have to take the entrance tests of critical thinking, intelligence and ability;
3. have to pass the panel interview; and
4. have to submit other required documents for admission.

Retention Policies

To be retained in the program, the student must:

1. maintain a satisfactory cumulative Grade Point Average (GPA) of 2.0 (85) or better in all subjects taken for the entire duration of the program; and
2. have not incurred a failure in any subject.
