

MASTER IN BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION

Program Description

The Master in Business Administration program equips the students with the knowledge and skills needed in the field of business. They are trained to be effective leaders in the work area and as entrepreneurs committed to ethical work practices and social responsibility.

Program Educational Objectives

This is a two-pronged program, whose objectives are:

1. to produce effective and successful entrepreneurs in the community who are conscious of their Christian responsibility, ethical standards and moral values in the conduct of their business;
2. to develop managers who are responsive to the needs of local and global business organizations taking into consideration new and diverse perspectives affecting the environment, social and economic well-being of the people they serve;
3. to improve professional students' research skills for the conduct of integrative and collaborative researches involving the various stakeholders of the society; and
4. to provide avenues for local and international linkages allowing professional students to become instruments of creative change in their respective business organizations and communities.

It further offers its students the challenge and the opportunity to integrate their academic studies into their active business experience.

Admission Policies

A student seeking admission to the program must comply with the following:

1. hold a degree in business, management or other related fields from an accredited college or university;
 - 1.1 if not a business degree holder the student is required to take Accounting for Non- Accountant refresher course.
2. at least 1 year working exposure in any business enterprise;
3. have a sufficient background in accounting;
4. have to take the entrance tests of aptitude (DAT) and critical thinking (Watson Glasser);
5. have to pass the panel interview; and
6. have to submit other required documents for admission

Retention Requirements

To be retained in the program, the student must:

1. maintain a satisfactory cumulative Grade Point Average (GPA) of 2.0 (85) or better in all subjects taken for the entire duration of the program; and
2. have not incurred a failure in any subject.
