Program Educational Objectives

This an advanced program in the teaching of preschool children. The course includes subjects important to the organization and administration of a preschool, and related disciplines towards the development of the preschool child, the family and the school settings.

Admission Policies

A student seeking admission to the program must comply with the following:

- 1. hold a degree in Early Childhood Education or with at least 12 units of professional courses in Education from an accredited college or university:
 - 1.1 an applicant with insufficient background in Education but a graduate of allied course like psychology, guidance and counseling, nursing and anthropology will be required to take prerequisite courses of up to 12 units of professional courses in education,
 - 1.2 an applicant with no background in Education or allied course will be required to take prerequisite courses of up to 18 units professional courses in education;
- 2. have to take the entrance tests of aptitude (CEM Graduate Level Test on Verbal, Quantitative and Inductive Reasoning) and essay that will measure written communication skill;
- 3. have to pass the panel interview; and
- 4. have to submit other required documents for admission.

Retention Policies

To be retained in the program, the student must:

- maintain a satisfactory cumulative Grade Point Average (GPA) of 2.0 (85) or better in all subjects taken for the entire duration of the program; and
- 2. have not incurred a failure in any subject.
