

MASTER IN NURSING

A. Non-Thesis Program

Program Description

This program prepares holders of the Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) degree for leadership roles in nursing.

Program Educational Objectives

Specifically, the program enables the graduate nurse to:

1. master theoretical and practical skills through critical thinking to improve the nursing profession;
2. deliver improved health care system in the country through high level practice of competencies and social responsiveness; and
3. develop advanced abilities and skills in the management of nursing program(s) in any health care setting, locally and globally

Admission Requirements

A student seeking admission to the program must comply with the following:

1. hold a degree in Bachelor of Science in Nursing from an accredited college or university;
2. hold a nurse's registration certificate;
3. take the entrance tests of aptitude (CEM - Graduate Level Test on Verbal, Quantitative and Inductive Reasoning) and essay that will measure written communication skill;
4. pass the interview; and
5. submit other required documents for admission.

Retention Policies

To be retained in the program, the student must:

1. maintain a satisfactory grade of 2.0 (85) or better in all subjects taken for the entire duration of the program. A student should re enrol a course if given an incomplete mark for more than a year.
2. have not incurred a failure in any subject.
