B. Thesis Program

Program Description

This program prepares holders of the Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) degree for leadership roles in nursing. This will challenge nurses in the improvement of nursing service, nursing education, and community health service through research.

Program Educational Objectives

Specifically, the program enables the graduate nurse to:

- applies theories and concepts in the delivery of safe and quality nursing care;
- utilizes research findings in the efficient and effective delivery of health care management in any health care setting through proper communication skills with patients/clients; and
- accepts the significance of research in the improvement of nursing towards social transformation

Admission Requirements

A student seeking admission to the program must comply with the following:

- hold a degree in Bachelor of Science in Nursing from an accredited college or university;
- 2. hold a nurse's registration certificate;
- 3. take the entrance tests of aptitude (CEM Graduate Level Test on Verbal,
 - Quantitative and Inductive Reasoning) and essay that will measure written communication skill;
- 4. pass the panel interview; and
- 5. submit other required documents for admission.

Retention Policies

To be retained in the program, the student must:

- maintain a satisfactory grade of 2.0 (85) or better in all subjects taken for the entire duration of the program. A student should reenrol a course if given an incomplete mark for more than a year.
- 2. have not incurred a failure in any subject.
